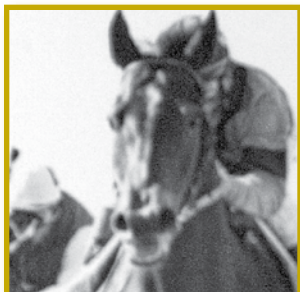

Dainty Dotsie was another of the “iron mares” who raced at Keystone, winning her debut here by 17 lengths in December of 1976. She won her next six starts before her first defeat in the Gr.III Ashland Stakes at Keeneland. After setting the track record at Penn National for 6 furlongs in her next effort, she finished her three-year

old season with 10 wins from 11 starts. Her biggest win was in the Gr.III Vagrancy H. at Aqueduct against What A Summer and Navajo Princess the following year. She was trained by James Cowden, Jr., and owned by James Cowden, Sr.



MY JULIET

1976 Sprint Champion My Juliet began her career at Nebraska’s Fonner Park before moving on to other Midwest tracks, and eventually the East Coast. As a three-year-old, she won nine of 15 starts including the Gr.I Cotillion at Keystone, where she never lost a race. She defeated colts in the Gr.II Vosburgh S. at Aqueduct,

the Michigan Mile and One Eighth H. at Detroit Racecourse, and in the Neshaminy H. at Keystone. A KY-bred trained by Leland Ripley, then Eugene Euster, and owned by George Weasel, Jr., My Juliet produced two stakes winning fillies by Alydar before dying at the age of 29.



SMARTY JONES

Roy and Pat Chapman’s Three-Year-Old Champion Smarty Jones captured the hearts of Pennsylvania’s racing fans with his exciting wins in the Kentucky Derby Gr.I and Preakness S. Gr.I. Trained by John Servis, and ridden by Stewart Elliott, the all time leading Pennsylvania-bred money earner began his

career at Philadelphia Park, won the Nursery Stakes, and was only the second Kentucky Derby winner to come into the race undefeated since Seattle Slew. Currently standing stud at Ghost Ridge Farm in York, PA.
