ANTHONY BLACK

Born in 1951 in Mt. Holly, NJ, Tony Black is the nephew of former jockey Sam Boulmetis, a 1973 inductee into the Racing Hall of Fame. At the age of 18, Black won at Liberty Bell with his first mount, Stand By Me, which paid \$154. Black has always been an advocate for the local jockey colony, and is President of the Philadelphia Park Jockey Association.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Won the PA Derby in 1996 and the Cotillion S. in 1977. Holds the record for most consecutive wins: in a two-day span won 9 at two different tracks. Rode Champions My Juliet, What A Summer and Candy Eclair. Won his 5,000th race in 2006. Rode in the International Jockey Series in Seoul, Korea in 2008.



STEWART ELLIOTT

Stewart Elliott was born in Toronto, Canada in 1965, the son of a jockey and showhorse trainer. His family spent six years in Korea before returning to North America. He began riding professionally at 16.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: In 2004, became the first jockey in twenty-five years to win the Derby in his first appearance in the race. He and Smarty Jones went on to win the Gr.I Preakness, and finish second in the Gr.I Belmont. Elliott rode the Three-Year-Old Champion throughout the colt's 8-race career. Won four races in one day at Aqueduct in 2008. Won three consecutive riding titles at Philadelphia Park. Scored his 3,000th career victory in May, 2003, and his 4,000th win in 2009.



RICK WILSON

Rick Wilson was born in 1953 in Hartshorne, OK, and began his career in 1970 in his home state riding Quarter Horses. His first Thoroughbred mount was in 1972 at La Mesa Park. Agents Jack Servis and Al Delapp booked his mounts. A near fatal injury in May 2005 at Pimlico ended his illustrious career.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Three times won five races in a single day at Philadelphia Park. Won nine titles at Philadelphia Park. Rode twice in the Kentucky Derby, once with favored Storm Tower who came into the Derby undefeated. Scored his 4,000th career win at Monmouth Park in 1997, the same year he won 12 stakes races. Regular rider of Champion Xtra Heat and Storm Tower, and for trainers Goose Heimer, Sal Campo, Ben Perkins, Jr., and John Scanlan.
