Bob Camac was born in Wilmington, DE and became a trainer in 1976. He and his wife Maryann owned a farm in Pedricktown, NJ. His most important contribution to racing was suggesting the breeding of Someday Farm's I'll Get Along to Elusive Quality in 2000.

Unfortunately, Camac didn't live to see the resulting foal, Three-Year-Old Champion Smarty Jones, as he

and his wife were killed suddenly the following year.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Won Gr.I Philip Iselin H. with Jolie's Halo in 1992. Won multiple graded stakes with Cagey Exuberance. Was leading trainer at Philadelphia Park 1988 Fall-Winter meet.



SCOTT A. LAKE

Born in 1965 in Harrisburg, PA. First win was with Niminy Piminy in 1987 at Penn National. Lives near Philadelphia with his wife, former jockey Jennifer Stisted, and his two children

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Won 8 training titles at Philadelphia Park, including 7 in a row from 1999-2005, and has also been leading trainer at Penn

National, Delaware Park, Pimlico and Laurel. Won his 5,000th race in December, 2010, the sixth trainer ever to do so. Led nation in wins in 2000, 2001, 2003 and 2006. Eclipse Award finalist in 2000 and 2001. Saddled Thunderello to a 2nd in the 2002 Breeders' Cup Sprint, and Shake You Down for a 3rd in 2003.



JOHN C. SERVIS

John Servis was born on October 25, 1958 in Charles Town, WV. into a racing family. His father was a jockey, and ran the Jockey Guild, while his uncle Jack Servis was a longtime jock's agent, as is his cousin, Donna. John tried the job, as well, before working as assistant to Mark Reid. He earned his license in 1984.

He lives with his wife and two sons in Bensalem.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Trained Champion Smarty Jones winner of the 2004 Kentucky Derby and Preakness, and second in the Belmont S. Trained multiple stakes winning fillies Jostle and Round Pond, and top two-year-old Rockport Harbor. Scored 1,000th career win in 2007 at Philadelphia Park.
